

COVID-19 Secure Guidance for Sedbergh People's Hall (dated at 25 May 2021)

We are cautiously returning the Hall back to "as near normal as we can" and rely on your common sense and your Covid experience over the past year to keep ourselves safe.

When you arrive, you can come straight in, but you shall: observe social distancing, sanitize your hands at least in and out; and wear a face covering, while you move around. Other than that, only two people in either of the male or female toilets and the kitchen.

We are applying the One Metre plus Mitigation rule allowing the seated capacity of the Main Hall to be 60 persons and the Committee Room to be 18 persons.

The mitigations include: being vaccinated; having had a negative Covid test in the last 48 hours; wearing a face covering. If individuals with a vulnerability or other concerns wish to sit two metres from other individuals, then let your event organiser know. Persons can sit closer together, if they live together, or are from the same household/bubble.

To reduce mingling, persons attending an event in the Main Hall shall enter and leave by the Main Entrance and persons attending an event in the Committee Room shall enter and leave by the Side (car park) Entrance.

Notes for Hirers

You are responsible for the Covid security of your event.

Provide and agree a Risk Assessment with Dr Barney (015396 2079).

Allow extra time to set up, clean and take down before/after each booked session.

Ensure sterilization points are set up with supplies.

The Main Hall will be bare. Chairs may be laid out at one metre side by side row separation and two metre between rows. Any tables used should be sponged and returned to store under the stage after use.

Committee Room has a fixed layout which may be changed to an agreed Risk Assessment.

The occupancy of the kitchen and the male and female side lobby toilets is two each.

The ventilation fan shall be on in the Main Hall (switch left side of the stage).

No consumption of alcohol until after 21 June 2021 (to be confirmed).

Keep a Track and Trace list for 21 days.
